## Refugees Update



Our last trip to the refugee camp, we brought along some gifts like used clothes, food & beverages, some toys, etc. We were there to follow up on the new camp site and to prepare for our next trip. We have also found the fact that there are 7,000 people in the camp. The figure given last time was inaccurate because the person got the information from one of the refugees instead of getting it from the authority.



Our next trip to Petchabun refugee camp is on 24 – 26 August. This trip, we will be focusing on:



1. Challenging and instilling the vision to the local Thai Hmong Christian villagers living surrounding the refugee camp to make effort in reaching the refugees with the gospel of hope in Jesus.

2. We hope to conduct a preaching/teaching meeting for children/adults at the refugee camp.

3. The refugees have expressed their needs for slippers for the children, more rice for each family (they are short by approximately 1½ tons a day), blankets for the coming winter. We are planning to contribute about 500—1,000 pairs of outdoor slippers for the children, 200 bibles in Hmong language, used clothes, blankets & towels, etc.



4. Lastly, we are looking at the site to build a meeting centre for the Hmong refugees. About a dozen children and staff from CCO will be going to present the gospel and to minister along on this trip.



Pray that everything would go accordingly to the Lord's plan.
