Building Project

CCOF is not equipped with a purpose-built sanctuary for worship and seminar. Instead it uses a multi-purpose hall which doubles up as a dining hall and worship hall. With a dream to reach the villagers as well as a need for a dedicated worship sanctuary, a building project is started. This 2-story building will serve as a worship hall on the top level and the ground floor can be used for mission outreach or small seminar rooms.

The sanctuary is due to be completed in Apr 2008 costing some USD\$113,000, we are continuing to believe God for the provision of the remaining USD\$87,000. Please pray with us!

TESTIMONY OF NAT

Name : Nutthawut Muangchai (Nat)
Date Of Birth : 28 January 1995

Of the 15 children who received water baptism, a 12 year old cheery looking boy made the decision for lifetime commitment - Just that he may not have the lifetime which we all perceive. He's HIV positive.

Nat was just 8 years old when he saw his mother succumb to the deadly AIDS virus and within 2 years his father passed on in the same manner, leaving him to his HIV infected grandmother with no means to care for a HIV infected grandson.

When Nat first arrived, he had to be shuttled to the hospital all so frequently because of his low immunity and many times he was at the brink of death.

Today, his immunity has surged up and he's playing like all the other kids! When volunteers ask him what he wants to be when he grows up? He replies with a sparkle in his eyes... A bible teacher!
