A Cross-cultural Relations Learning Trip

A Work Trip

You may be expected to spend at least eight hours a day of dedicated work such as mural wall painting, making of handicrafts, mending fish breeding nets, landscaping, farming, teaching English and the like.

A Fun Trip

Depending on your schedule, you may have some time for recreation, soccer, fishing, elephant riding, river rafting, shopping & sight-seeing.

A Spiritual Trip

Through the morning and evening devotions and ministering of the various outreaches, spiritual lives are deepened and strengthened.

An Evangelistic, Seed Sowing Experience Trip

Through giving out Gospel literature, testimonies, participating with music, puppets or however, you will instill the Word of God in their lives. You will bring souls to salvation through faith in the Lord Jesus.

DRESS CODE

The following dress code contains the general standards set for the orphanage in Thailand. All persons participating in this trip MUST BE WILLING to adjust their appearance and behavior to blend with the customs of the country in which they are working.

Approved dress code for GIRLS

Dresses, skirts, which are knee length or longer, pants and jeans are to be worn for all ministry meetings. No spaghetti strap tops or tank tops should be worn during these meetings. Mid-thigh length or longer shorts, jeans and pants can be worn for traveling, working, downtown shopping and recreation.

Approved dress code for GUYS

Long pants or jeans are preferred to be worn for all ministry meetings. You may wear shorts, jeans or pants for traveling, working, downtown shopping and recreation.

...Continue Personal Notes What to bring ... 1. Sufficient clothes for the duration of your stay. Washing machine is available at CCO. 2. Work clothes that you don't mind getting ruined with paint or stain. 3. Nice clothes for school meetings, evening meetings or church service. 4. Towel and wash cloth, soap, shampoo and toiletry articles. 5. Work gloves, hat or cap for sun protection while at work. 6. Sleeping bag if you're planning to spend the night in the interior jungle. We provide bunks with mattresses at CCO. 7. Flashlight. 8. Slippers, tongs, flip-flops or sandals. 9. Shoes for sports. 10. If you take prescription drugs, please bring enough for the entire trip. Bedrooms/Dormitories & Bathrooms Guidelines 1. Do not leave the lights and fan on when no one is in the room. 2. Sanitary napkins must be thrown into the trash bin and not into the toilet bowl. 3. You are responsible to empty the trash bin as and when it's needed. 4. At all times, keep your room clean. "Cleanliness is next to Godliness." 5. Be considerate. No loud music, noise or lights on after lights out

Safety Box

There is a safe available for team leader to store passports, cash and traveling documents for the team at the office upon request.

Laundry

We provide the use of washing machine. Please use appropriate soap powder for machine used. Try to maximize the load of clothes according to instruction.

Internet & Electricity

Usage of internet broadband is available and free. Thailand's electric supply is 220 –240 volts. Most power points for the plugs are two flat prongs or two round prongs. Adapters can be bought if your plugs do not fit.

Boy/Girl Relationship

Your purpose in this trip is serving in missions with Care Corner Orphanage. We encourage you to be friendly with everyone, but refrain from spending time with just one particular person most of the time, especially the opposite sex. Strictly no dating for singles!

Currency

You may get a better exchange rate for Thai baht in your country. Check with your local money changer in your city/town and compare the rates in any Thai banks from the internet, or go to "www.xrates. com" to check the rates. Visa & Master credit cards are well accepted.

Sickness

In case of sickness, please let us know. Don't be a hero! We have a basic medical supplies at the orphanage to meet your basic medical needs. In case of emergency, our 24 hr. hospital is only 5 km/10 min. drive away.

Security

Don't leave the grounds alone or without permission. Your leaders must know where you are at all times. No one is to leave the compound except in a group with permission from your leaders. Team leaders must have a photocopy of team members' passports/travel documents at all times.

Food

All of our meals are prepared in our own kitchen by our staff. If there is any special medical diet required, please let us know ahead of time. Our motto for food is, "where He leads me I will follow; what He feeds me I will swallow" ©

Water

We are very proud of our mineral water system. Our well is over 60 meters deep and the water passes through a macro filter before coming through the taps. It is safe to use the tap water for brushing teeth. Our drinking water goes through micro filters that are available in all our kitchens.

How Much Does It Cost?

Approximately TH β 15,000 Baht per person a week or TH β 50,000 Baht per person a month. This includes:

- Airport transfer to and fro from Chiang Mai International Airport to CCO
- Transportation for all traveling within Chiang Mai
- Food & Accommodation
- All materials for community work
- · Sight-seeing, Outing/Fun time

CCO has accommodation for a maximum of 30 people at any one time. The charges depends upon the program, the number of people in the group or the individual.
